



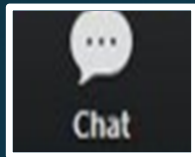

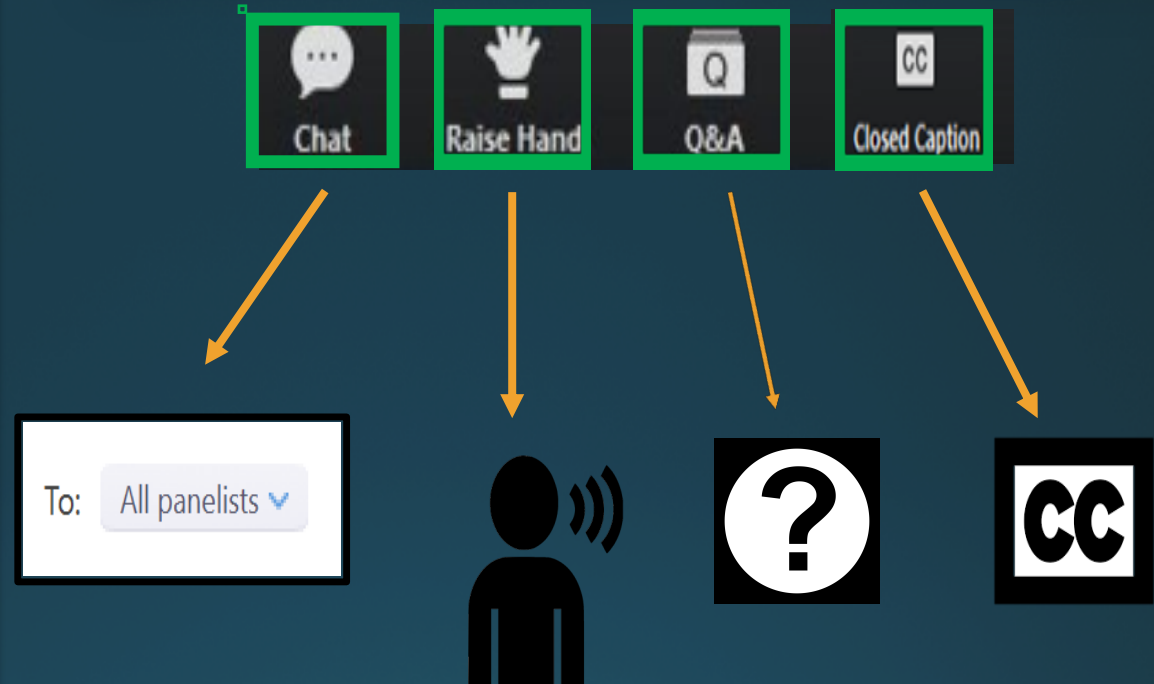

- 2014 Money Follows the Person (MFP) funding approved by CMS
- 31 tribal nations coordinating across several levels of government
 - tribal
 - state
 - federal
 - city/urban

MFP – Tribal Initiative

Goal:

Establish sustainable and culturally appropriate long-term services and supports in tribal communities

Principles

- Promote government-to-government relations
- Enhance tribal infrastructure
- Increase access to needed services
- Address disparities
- Design and implement effective programs
- Maximize fiscal resources

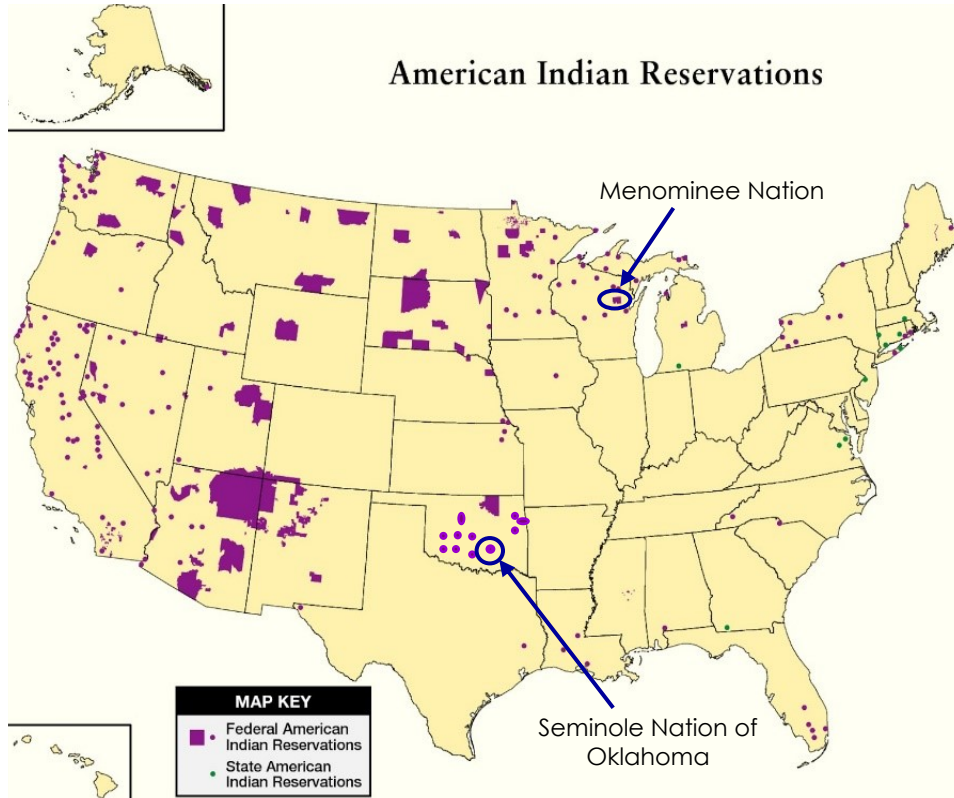
