



#### The information library has 2 key topics:


- Planning an LTSS program

# **ITU Interactive Program Map**



- In the ITU Program Map, select a state to view a list of service providers organized by city and tribe
- Data include contact information for each program, whether they are a Title VI grantee, and the services provided



# LTSS Planning Roadmap



The LTSS information library includes the following steps for planning and implementing an LTSS program:

- Step 1: Needs Assessment
- Step 2: Goals and Objectives
- Step 3: Compare Models
- Step 4: Select Model
- Step 5: Planning
- Step 6: Implementation
- Step 7: Evaluation






## LTSS and Dementia
