Dear Commissioner Bettencourt:

On August 5, 2020, the Department of Health and Human Services and the Department of the Treasury approved New Hampshire's State Innovation Waiver under Section 1332 of the Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act (ACA). New Hampshire's approved application waives the ACA's requirement for the single risk pool to the extent necessary to implement a state reinsurance program called the New Hampshire Reinsurance Program for plan years 2021 through 2025.

This letter is to notify you that the pass-through funding associated with this waiver for calendar year 2024 is estimated to be \$28,035,719, which must be used for purposes of implementing New Hampshire's State Innovation Waiver. This amount will be subject to a final administrative determination by the Department of the Treasury prior to payment.
